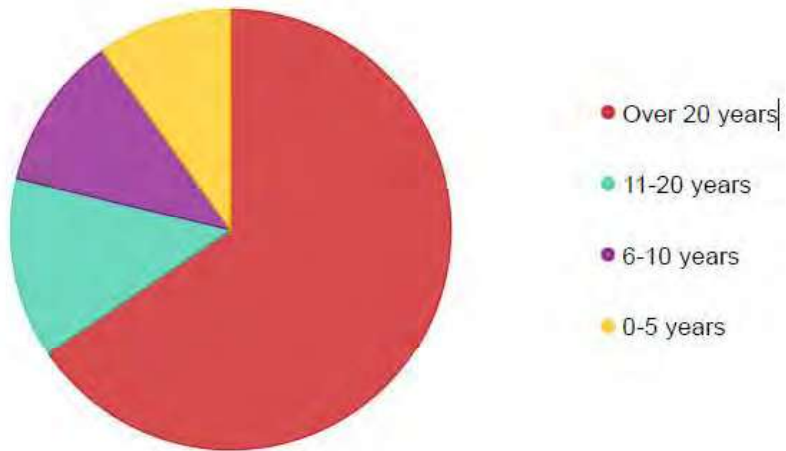

1. How long have you lived in Burton Township? *

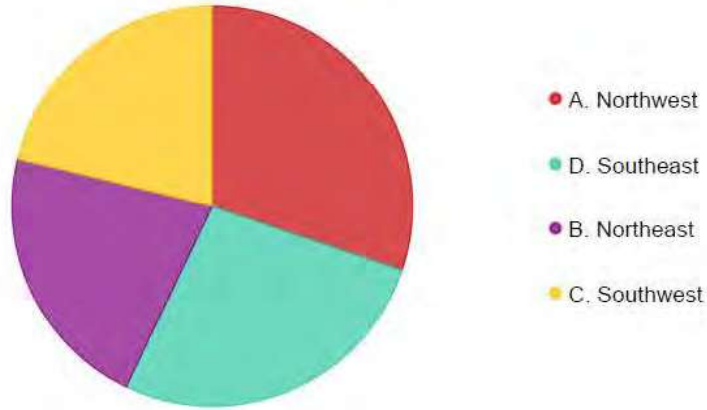

2. In what area of the Township do you live? (see image below)

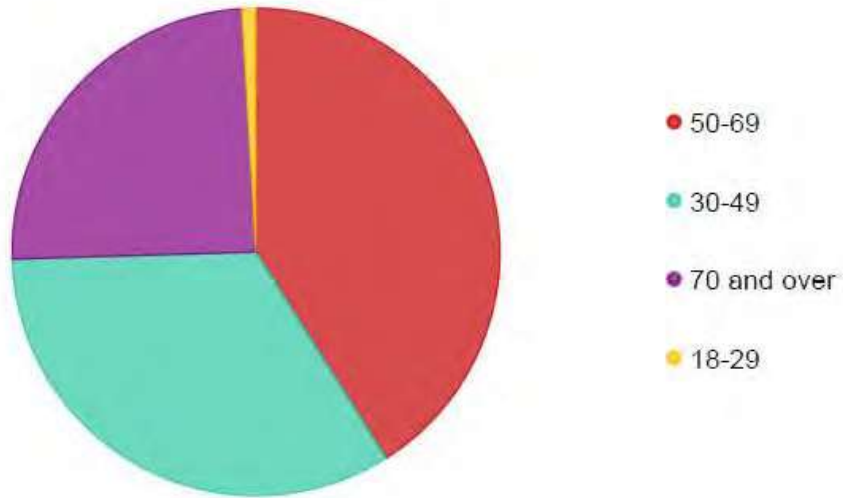

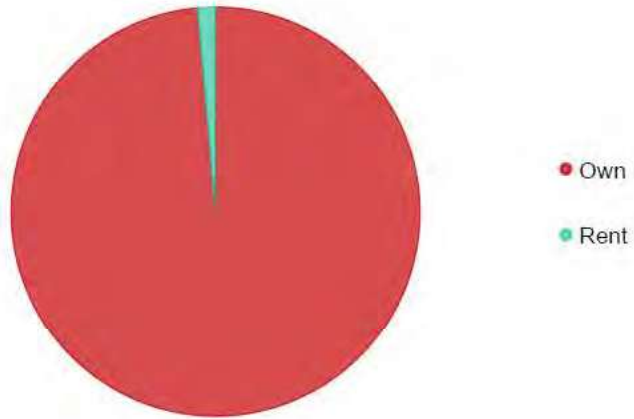

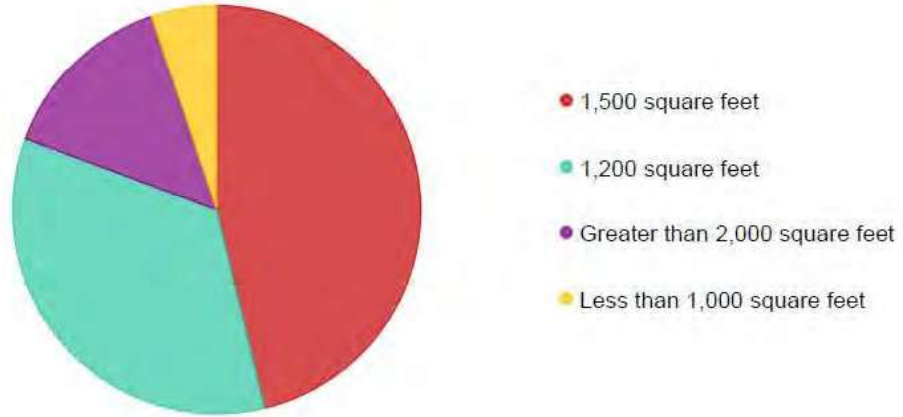

5. What do you feel is the best minimum amount of floor area for a new...

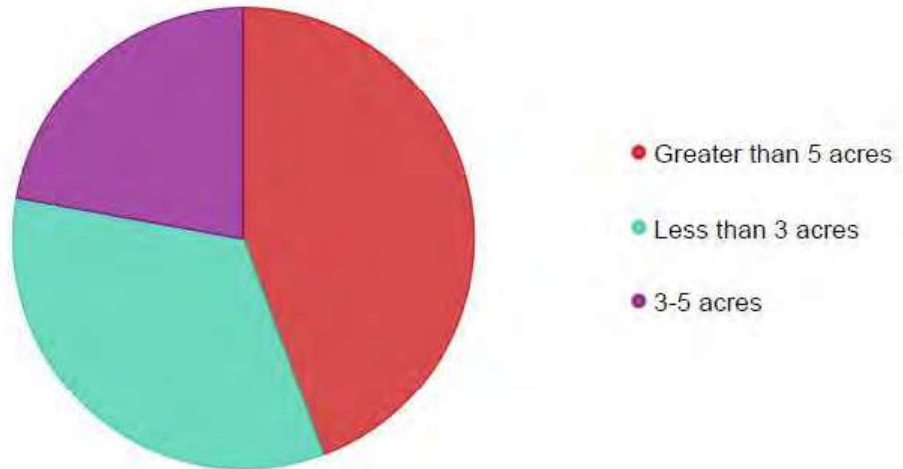

6. On what size lot is your home located? *

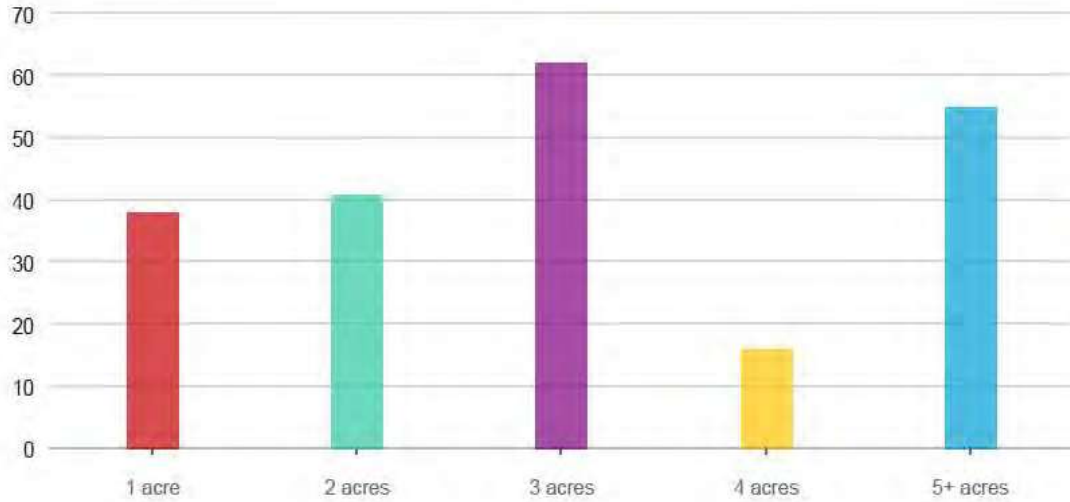

7. What do you feel is the best minimum lot size for a new single-family... *

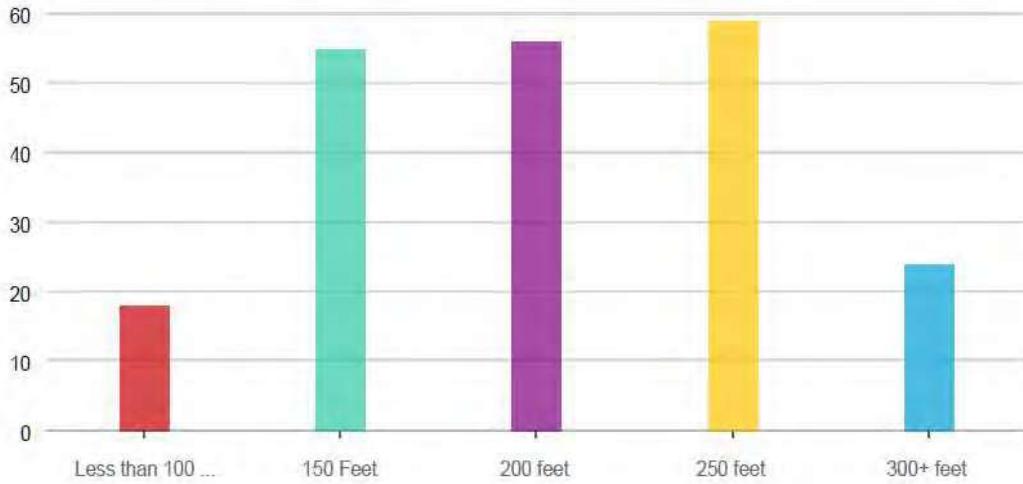

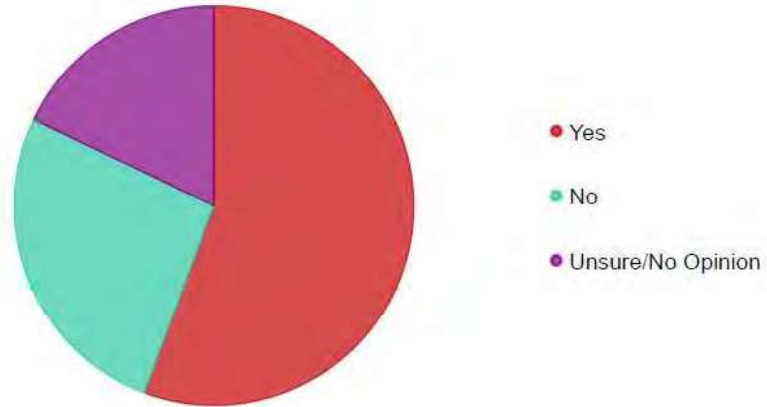

9. Do you support the zoning concept of “flag lots”?

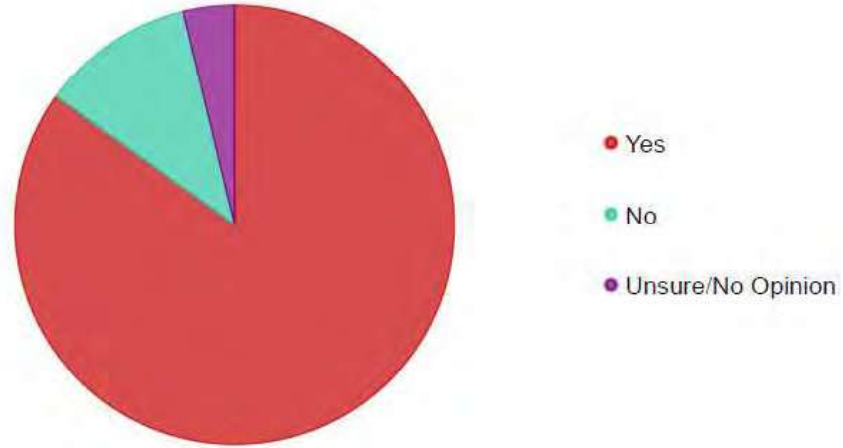

10A. Do you support the general concept of an ADU?

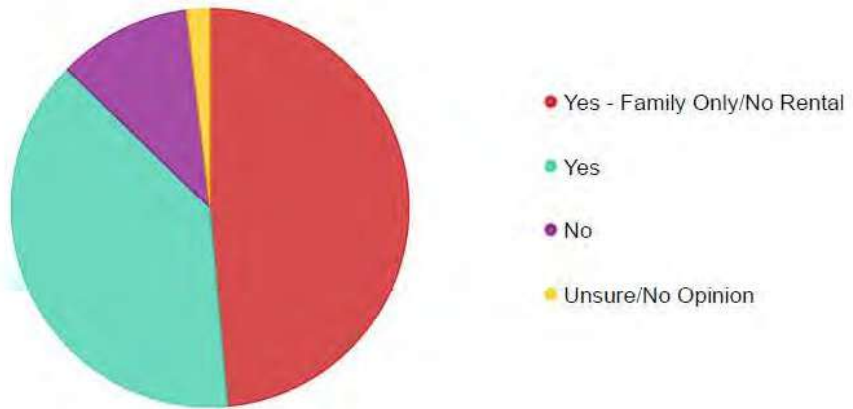

10B. Do you feel the Township should allow for an ADU?

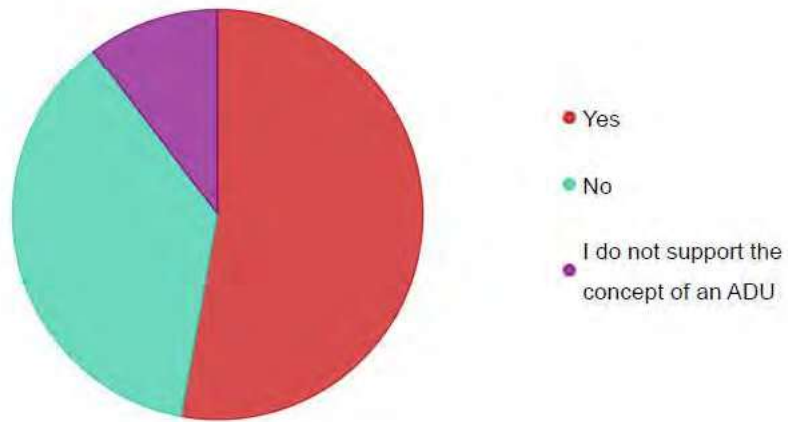

10C. Should the ADU be restricted to immediate family members only?

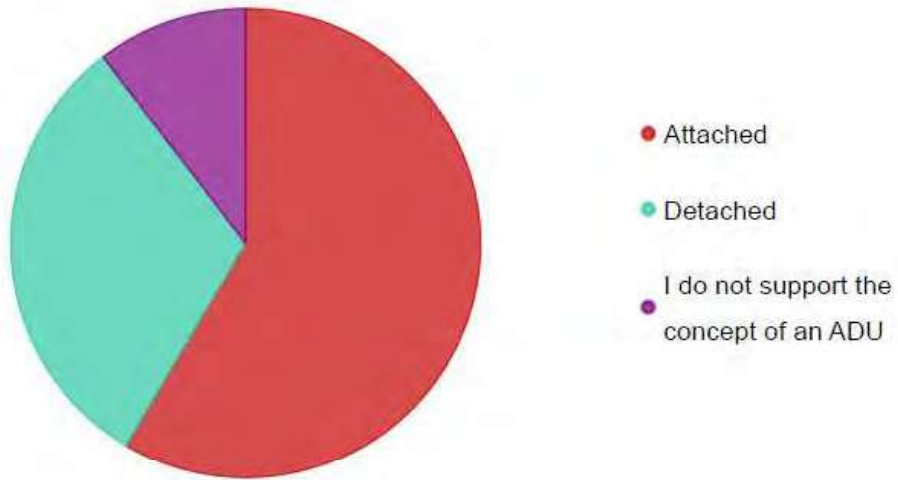

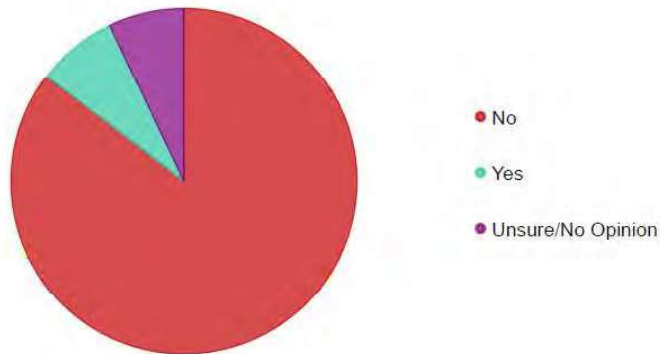
11. Do you support changing the zoning for any of the following types of housing?

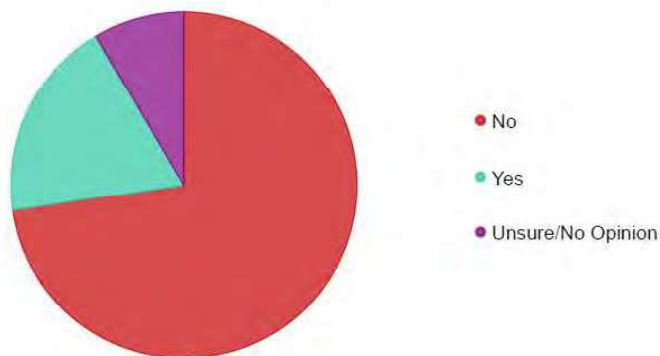

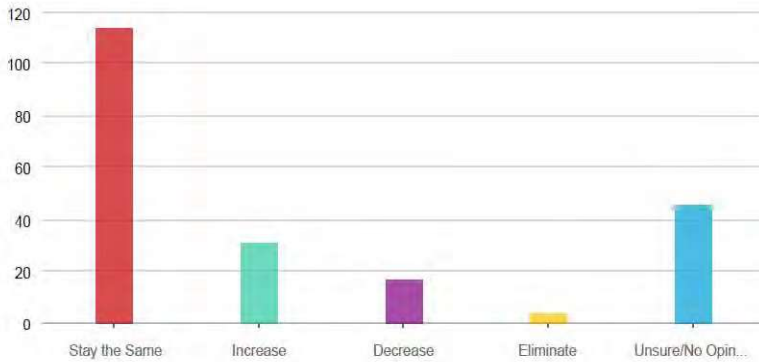

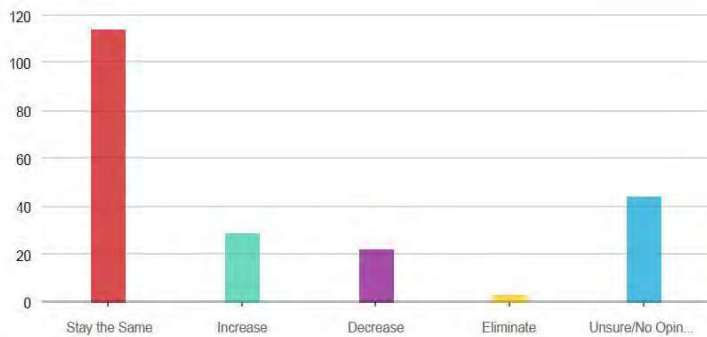
12A. Would you like to see the Commercial/Office (C-O) Districts Change?

To Direct Development into Areas Best Suited:

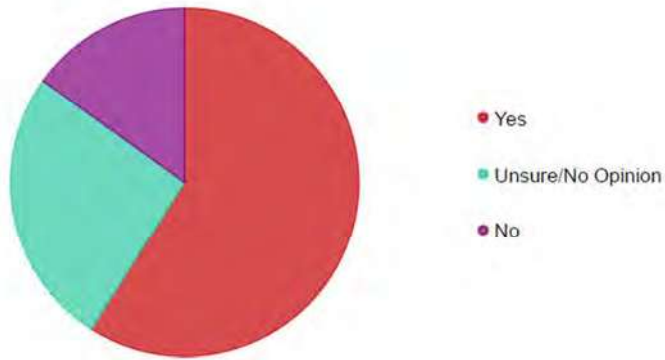

We are losing 2 wonderful neighbors across the street from us because the Zoning committee would not allow them to build another home on about 3 acres of land. They are moving in December and we are SO SORRY to see them go. They are moving to Middlefield. They own almost 8 acres of land and the home they inhabit is more than a century home. They wanted to build on the less than 3 acres. WE built our home in 1997 on a lot that is ONLY 2.34 acres. We thought it was very narrow minded of the zoning committee!	1

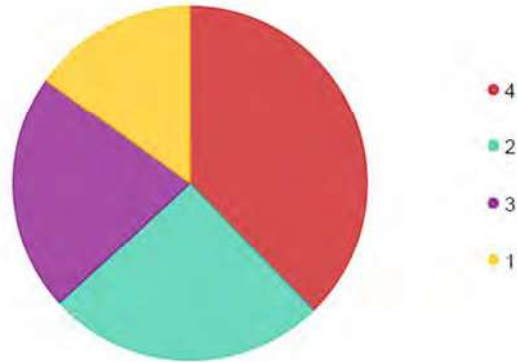

Since the Middlefield Township side of Chipmunk has no zoning and multi structure lots are common, the landowners Burton Township side of Chipmunk Lane are also wanting to do the same. Burton Township has many acres of unprotected wetlands, bogs and fens. These habitats are rare, and contain many plants and animals that are rare or endangered in the state; or have very habitat specific requirements. They can't be replaced, mitigated or otherwise changed to protect what is already there. Nothing is in place to protect vulnerable habitats from being negatively altered by timbering, no development setbacks and land use. In addition, the use of firearms in residential areas should have some reasonable limitations; safety setbacks, minimum lot size, noise limits, quiet hrs, etc. The constant complaints heard from friends, neighbors and on social networks all seem to point in the same direction. A little is OK, a lot is too much. A compromise could be attained to help everyone enjoy living in Burton. There has been a shift to a more residential than farmland lifestyle, particularly in the western half of the township, yet the firearms rules are non existent.	1

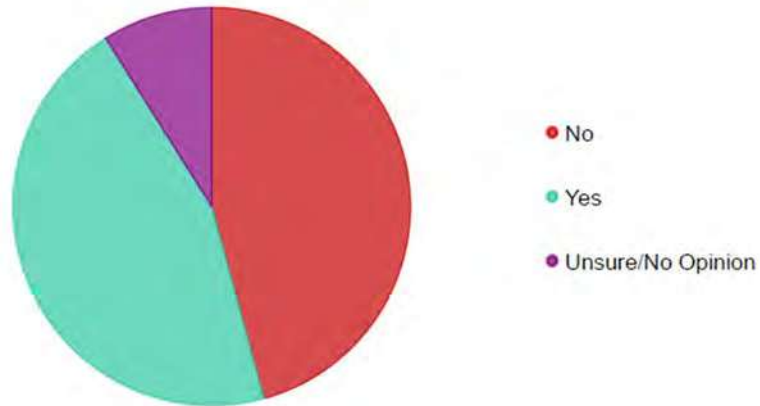

Wish that Preston Ford did not use Aspen Hills Development for all test drives for new and used cars as well as each and every test drive for any vehicle being repaired there. It is unreal the amount of traffic as well as they speed to test the cars. Not safe at all.	1
We live on 'dead man's curve' on Rt 700. There have been many accidents in front of our home and some of them have been fatal! We complained to ODAT to have them reduce the speed limit, since this IS 2 lane road, with much traffic. We were told that there weren't THAT MANY accidents or deaths so they changed nothing. 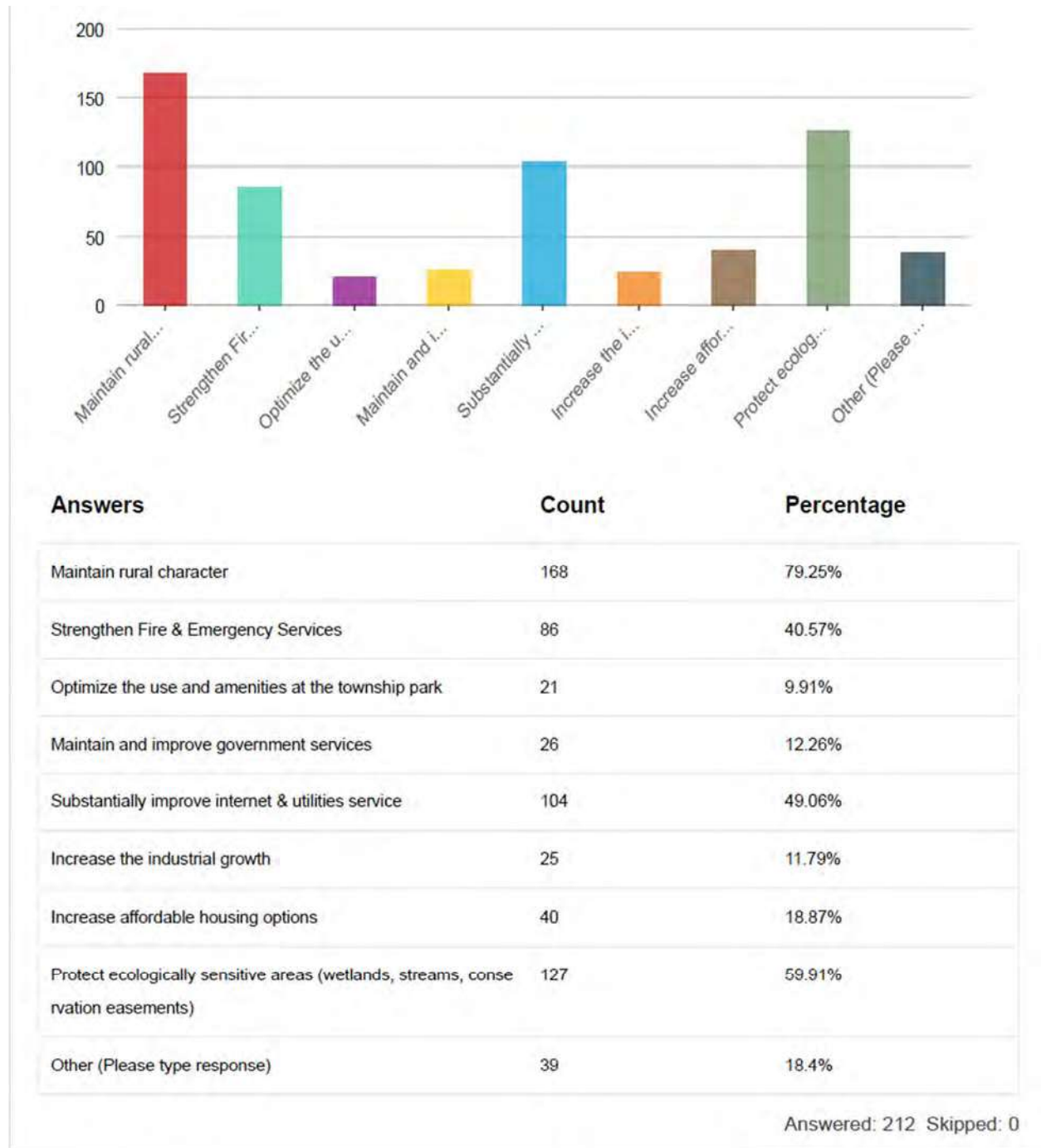
